



2023 Goals

- 1) Find Ways to Serve Additional Families.
- 2) Expand to Prescott Valley (\$250k needed).
- 3) Final phase capital campaign to serve up to 16 families annually through the nine-unit complex.

2022 Prescott Valley expansion plan began. Family of 5 graduated Agape and purchased home. 14 families served (55 individuals, 3 pregnant mothers), 2 babies born, 7 staff members.

2021 Board focused on leadership, growth, and fundraising. \$150k Grant for apartment renovations. Mike Kimmel became Executive Director. 13 families served (47 individuals, 2 pregnant mothers), 5 staff members.

2020 Grant writing focused on expansion. First baby born at Agape House, healthy and protected. 10 families served (34 individuals), 3 staff members.

2019 ‘Agapeville’ nine-unit apartment building purchased. Over 400 Partners (churches, individuals, businesses, clubs) supported Agape House. 8 families served (27 individuals), 3 staff members.

2018 Agape House rented office. Added Life Skills Training & Financial Management classes. Grandmother graduated from Agape and purchased home. 8 families served (27 individuals), 3 staff members.

2017 Became member of nationwide organization to expand knowledge on programming, leadership, marketing, Bible study materials. 4 families served (12 individuals), 2 staff members.

2016 Each resident received one volunteer mentor checking in once a week for budgeting and life skills. 5 families served (18 individuals), primarily volunteer based organization.

2015 Helping families began! Three Families Served (12 individuals) including 2 single mothers and 1 single father, 9 students - elementary to high school age.

2014 Research began, and roots were planted. Fundraising included yard sales, craft sales, and the first Poinsettia Campaign. One part-time staff.

2013 Incorporated Jan 31, 2013. Co-Founders: Neil & Cindy Campbell, Jim Flower. Becky Mitchell joined to start planning. Prayed for ways to help homeless families.
