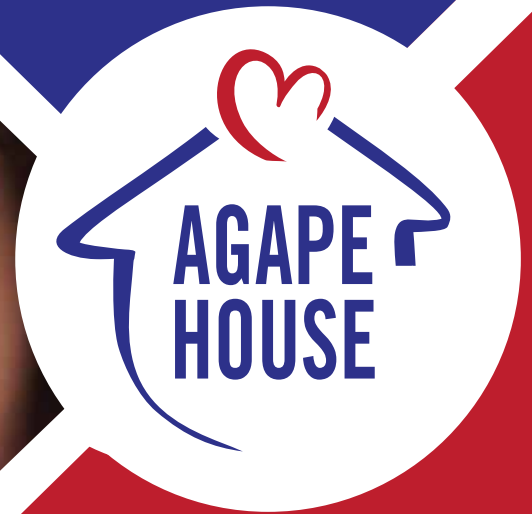
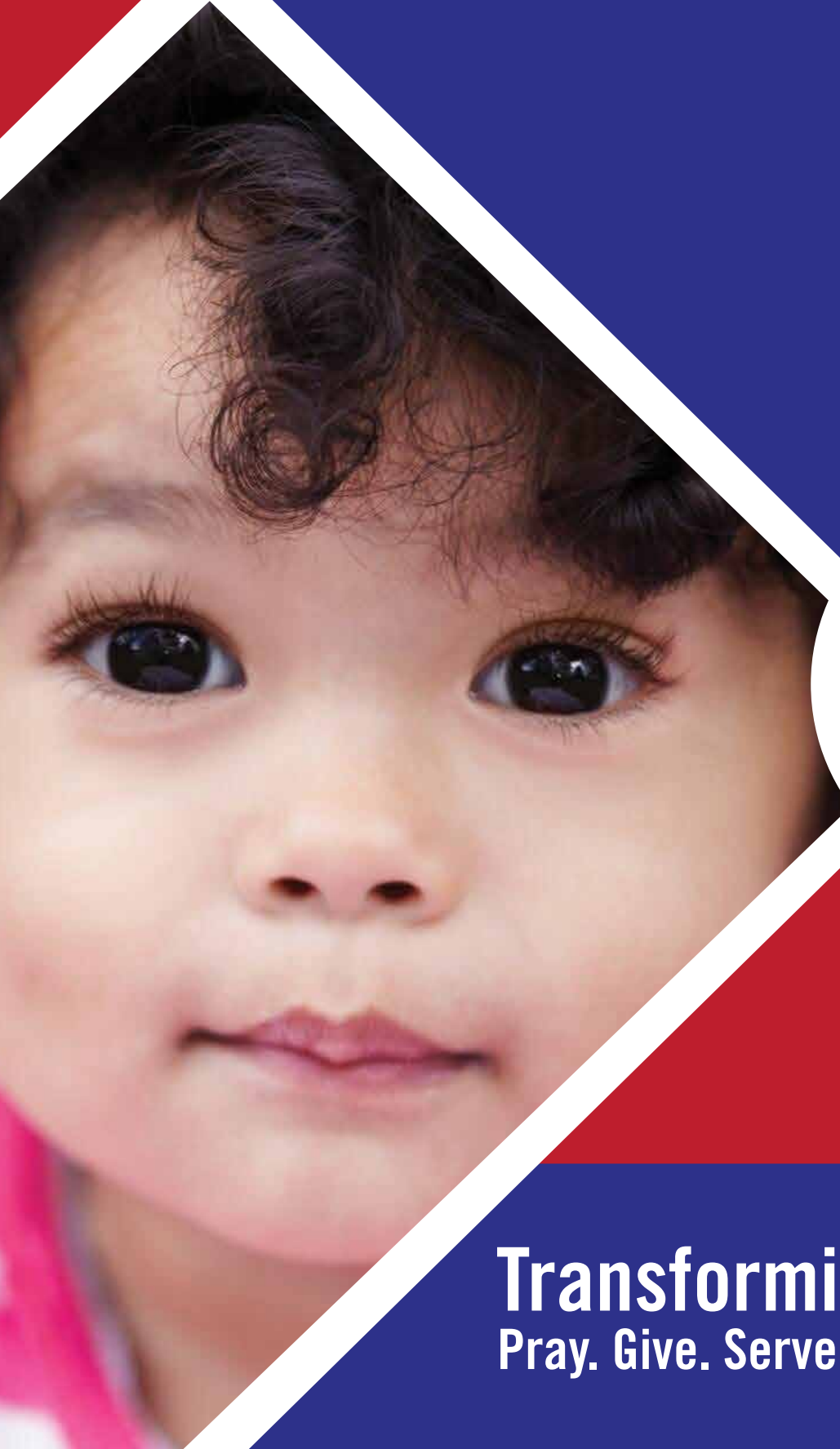

### 31 FAMILIES PER MONTH CALL FOR HOUSING ASSISTANCE

In 2025, our compassionate phone lines received on average 31 calls each month from those seeking housing. Each time, immediate local phone numbers and resources were given verbally. Those unable to find housing immediately were encouraged to keep in contact, and Agape House served 11 families in 2025.

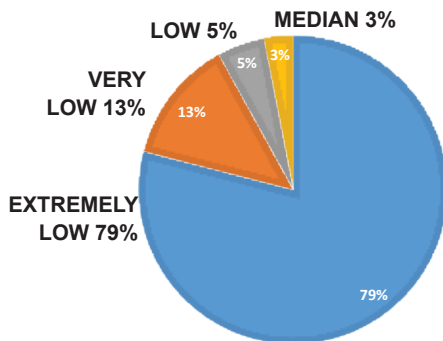

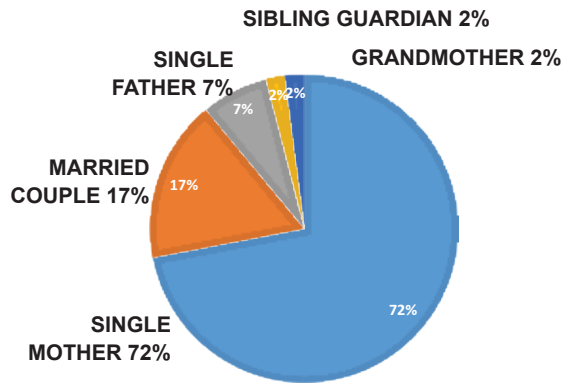

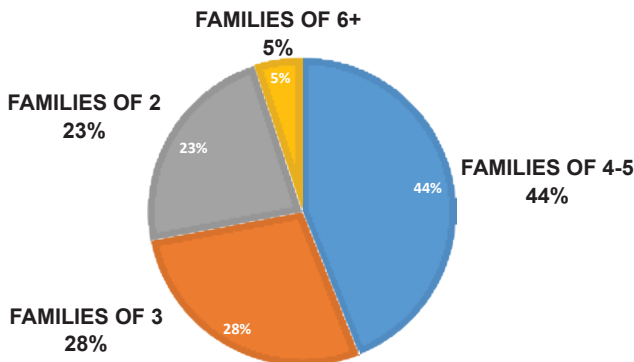

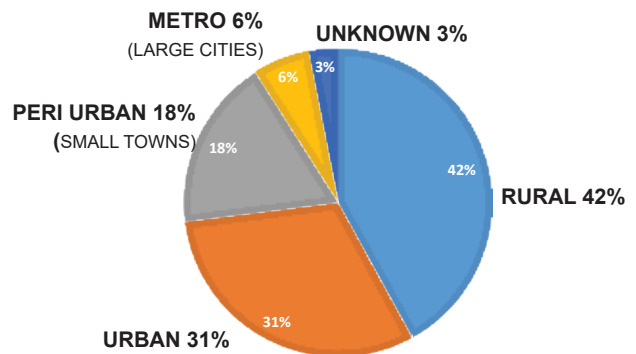
### HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD

92% of households start the program at Agape House with very low or extremely low incomes. Through career development, the goal is for families to graduate from the program having reached a level of reasonable, livable wages through job advancement.

## OUR MISSION

We exist to provide long-term transitional housing for families who are without a residence. We work to rebuild and transform families' lives and prepare them for an independent and self-sustained future.



## WHERE WE BEGAN

Incorporated January 31, 2013, Agape House began serving three to four families each year through transitional housing in individual apartments in January 2015. As we began to grow, we obtained a nine-unit apartment complex in 2019, serving up to seven families at a time with 6-24 months of transitional housing and services. The conversation for the Prescott Valley Expansion began in 2021. Three families were served in two homes at Prescott Valley in 2025, and we project to be able to serve six families at a time upon completion of the PV campus.



On the Prescott primary campus, one of the apartments is used as a community room where we hold Life Skills classes, Finance Classes, Cooking Classes, Bible Studies, and counseling, and provide meals and laundry facilities.

## OUR VISION

Currently Agape House has a nine-unit apartment complex in Prescott and six units in Prescott Valley. Agape House Case Managers, Mentors and Counselors have the ability to serve 13 families at a time (approximately 55 parents and children) with the addition of the Prescott Valley Expansion.

Currently, we own 15 units debt free and there is much momentum behind us from supporters and donors for an addition of 20 more units in the future.

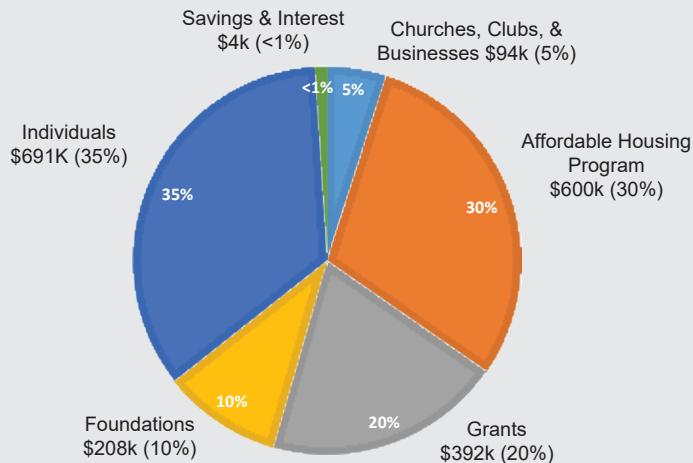


# Financial Transparency

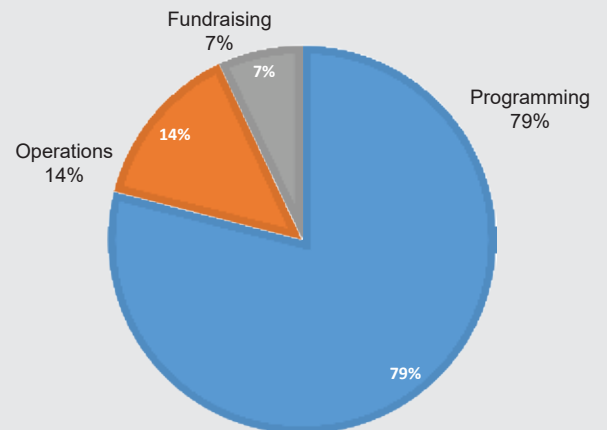
Since 2013, Agape House has been blessed with over 2,185 donors, including 200 who have faithfully supported us for more than six years. In 2025 alone, 712 donors contributed, and we currently have 96 monthly and quarterly donors, totaling \$12,649.35 each month, with gifts ranging from \$10 to \$1,000. It typically takes about 20 donors to support one family through the Agape House program. Contributions come in various forms: monthly giving, annual AZ Charitable Tax Credit donations, and year-end gifts. Thank you for making a difference!
